

Public Realm is a key issue for the town. We are working in partnership with Lincolnshire County Council to develop a public realm strategy for our market towns. This document will ensure a joined up approach to public realm and identify key sites to prioritise action. You will be invited to give your views on this as the project develops.

The Town Council, Lincolnshire Coop, Horncastle Walkers are Welcome and the Horncastle Trade Association are working together for a Horncastle Community Clear Up Day on March 26th 10am - 12noon.
