


Working together with partners, and informed by public feedback, the projects make the most of the towns' existing assets and will create new opportunities within the local economy.







MOVING FORWARD

Skegness Learning Campus

The Skegness Learning Campus is a flagship project for Connected Coast and has the potential to be an economic game changer for the area.

This project, led by TEC Partnership, will see the creation of a new, state of the art learning campus which will provide a vibrant environment where young people and adults will be inspired to learn and thrive.

The learning available through the campus will allow local people to gain the skills and knowledge they need to get the jobs they want, and meet the needs of local employers too.

An application for planning permission for the learning campus has been submitted, and if successful, it is expected that work could begin in spring 2023.

MOVING FORWARD

Skegness Interchange

Skegness Railway Station is an important gateway into the town, and through this project, the welcome that it provides for people arriving will be significantly improved. In addition, through this project – which is being led by East Midlands Railway and Network Rail – new facilities will also be provided for the local community.

The project will see a full renovation of the main station building, the old Red Star building, and the internal concourse at Skegness railway station. New facilities will be developed, including commercial units and a separate community room that can be used by community groups or for uses such as learning and education. There will also be improvements to the outside of the station.

With detailed designs drawn up that show the extent of the transformation, the plans for the project are taking shape ahead of work starting in 2023.

Through including carbon reduction and neutral elements, and the new community hub and learning space, Skegness will be promoted as a leader in community rail and innovation.

MOVING FORWARD

Town Centre Transformation

This project, led by Heritage Lincolnshire, will transform Skegness' historic town centre through a programme of improvements.

Through the Town Centre Transformation Scheme, grants ranging from 50% to 90% will be made available to building owners to invest in repairing or restoring their buildings. These improvements will include improving and repairing shop fronts, and making use of empty upper floors. By the end of October 2022, there were seven projects progressing through the stages of the grant scheme.

There will also be work carried out to improve Tower Gardens which will complement the improvements in the town centre. It is hoped the design will be developed in early 2023.

Skegness Foreshore

The development of the Foreshore will provide more opportunities for people to enjoy and experience Skegness, with cultural, heritage, arts, sports and leisure facilities and activities all set to be on offer on the site.

This project, which is being led by East Lindsey District Council, will make use of the existing structures around the boating lake to create an outdoor events arena as well as improvements to local facilities.

With the area welcoming around 2.2 million holiday visitors each year, the development of the Skegness Foreshore will strengthen the town as a tourist hotspot, whilst offering new facilities for local people.

The project has taken a step forward with the marketing of five prime sites along the Foreshore beginning in the summer, attracting national and regional interest.

MOVING FORWARD

Cultural Skegness

This Embassy Theatre is set to house one of the first culture houses in the country which will bring new cultural and arts activities for the area.

The redevelopment of the theatre, which has been a mainstay of the town since 1926, will reflect a Scandinavian culture house concept and will see the construction of a new two storey cultural involvement centre at the theatre. The centre will incorporate a lounge, café/bar, as well as informal meeting spaces, improved visitor seating in the foyers, and multi-use workshop space.

Once complete, the Embassy Theatre will offer new and exciting opportunities for creativity, performance art, music, and learning.

In August 2022, councillors gave planning consent for the redesign and in the autumn, project lead Magna Vitae secured additional arts council funding after achieving National Portfolio Organisation status.

EARLY ACHIEVEMENTS

Accelerated Funding Projects


The Connected Coast Board received an additional Accelerated Fund grant of £750,000 in 2020 to support early work to make a difference for Skegness. With additional match funding from East Lindsey District Council, the grant award delivered the part- pedestrianisation of **Tower Esplanade**. These works form part of an adopted Masterplan for Skegness and now provide a larger, safer and more diverse trading environment at the main visitor gateway to the resort, and key link between the Skegness town centre and Foreshore. These works also release other under-utilised sites along the Foreshore for additional investment through improved access and commercial viability by redirecting all peak visitor traffic passed/into these alternative sites via Princes Parade.



Immediate Delivery on the Ground

The approved refurbishment of the former Magistrates Court in Skegness has already been completed to provide a new **police training academy**. The academy provides Lincolnshire Police with new learning and development training facilities, as well as a new conference and meeting venue and office accommodation for the Probation Service. The development of the police training academy means new recruits no longer have to always travel to Lincoln for training and it will help recruit and retain local officers. The project received a £1M contribution through the Towns Fund Investment Plan award for Skegness, and was delivered in conjunction with funding from the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Probation Service.

The development of a new multi-user trail connecting Chapel St Leonards and Ingoldmells to provide a series of cycling, walking, and public transport connections has also been completed. The new **multi-user trail** for cycling and walking connects to a large bus turnaround that will allow visitors to the area to travel onto popular locations such as Fantasy Island, Butlins, and the town. The trail then joins existing roads and paths to create a free to use, four- mile - long circular route, which connects to the beach and promenade. The project received £500k in Towns Fund support.



LOOKING AHEAD

With all the Skegness projects approved by government, delivery on the ground is now gathering pace. In the coming year, there are some significant delivery milestones to look forward to, including:

- **Winter 2022** – planning decision expected for Skegness Learning Campus; work expected to start in early 2023
- **Spring 2023** – shortlisted schemes selected for the Foreshore; work expected to start in December 2023
- **Spring 2023** - Skegness Interchange work set to start
- **Early 2023** – procurement work begins for the first phase ‘culture house’ refurbishment at the Embassy Theatre; work expected to start in May 2023
- **Late Autumn 2023** - Capital works for Tower Gardens are expected to be on site.

THE STRATEGIC ROLE OF THE BOARD

The board will be following the further guidance issued by Government for boards as they move into delivery phase of the projects.

Building on its track record to date and its strong approach to partnership working, the strategic role of the board is being expanded to take a holistic approach to delivering improvements for Skegness. UK Shared Prosperity projects will come under the board's governance, and if Skegness' Levelling Up Fund Bid is successful, the role of governing this will also be added to the Connected Coast board's remit

Both funding streams offer exciting potential and opportunities for Skegness. Combining these funds and activities with the Town Deal investment and projects will mean the Connected Coast Town Deal can take a joined up approach to delivering for Skegness.



THE STRATEGIC ROLE OF THE BOARD

Levelling Up Fund

Exciting plans to regenerate and revitalise East Lindsey have been included as part of bid to the Government's Levelling Up Fund. The Levelling Up Fund is a separate government funding stream that contributes to the levelling up agenda by investing in infrastructure that improves everyday life across the UK, including regenerating town centre and high streets, upgrading local transport, and investing in cultural and heritage assets. It was introduced to help drive capital investment in projects that have been identified as priorities by local stakeholders and will have the most impact within their local area.

If successful, East Lindsey would gain more than £8.1m to work with its partners on cultural and tourism projects in the market towns of Alford and Spilsby. The money would secure the future of heritage assets, adding to the tourism offer across the Lincolnshire Wolds as well as complement the Towns Deal funding already secured for projects in Skegness and Mablethorpe.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund

East Lindsey was allocated £4.4M in funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

The fund is a key part of the Government's 'Levelling Up' agenda to provide money for councils to specifically invest in three priority areas: local communities and places; support for local businesses; and people and skills.

The application has been made collaboratively by South and East Lincolnshire Councils Partnership.

Extensive consultation took place to directly gauge public opinion and hear what people want for their local communities. East Lindsey is considering where this funding should be invested to create maximum benefits and meet the needs of communities and people.
