'Information Sharing Agreement' – (ISA)



Inspector Morrice said: "The new ISA between ourselves and the Caravan Park Watch Scheme members will mean that we can share information about individuals we suspect are involved in caravan crime. We can give photos of those people to security staff on the parks so they know who to look out for and we can provide other data, as appropriate, if it helps to prevent crime".

We have joined forces with the Police, Insurers, and Manufacturers to reduce crime & improve customer services.

CPW works in conjunction with NHS Healthcare, Coastal Access for all and the security Industry.

We hold regular meetings to keep up to date with local occurrences, crime statistics and invite different agencies to join us and discuss matters whom it concerns.

We are a member's only information sharing agreement group allowing the police to share photos of those committing caravan crimes in the area. We have instant communication with the police through members email.

Future plans for the group include... Working with insurance companies to introduce reductions on policy costs.

Having the fire and rescue service attend a future meeting to discuss flood plans.

Pro-actively promoting the group to other Caravan Industries, the Public and our customers.

What we have achieved & introduced:

- Crime prevention packs & UV pens.
- ✓ Working closely with industry insurance who sponsored and provided caravan security stickers.
